2022 has been another incredible year for the Sussex Cricket Foundation. We continue to see participation rise across all areas of the game and with no sign of this stopping, we need to ensure we continue to make the game as accessible for all as possible.

There have been many highlights during 2022 including:

- $\bullet$  DIScoverABILITY Day a record 600 young people & adults attended another memorable day.
- Schools Day over 1500 children visited
   The 1st Central County Ground during our LV
   Championship game vs. Leicestershire.
- Volunteers Day 500 volunteers attended an RL50 game vs. Surrey where we also presented our Grassroots Cricket Awards & ECB Coach Awards.
- Junior Champions League 5 clubs providing 6 teams & 70 players had the opportunity to play at a first-class venue.
- Brighton Aldridge Community Academy (BACA) – continued support to our state school of choice for cricket who also features in the Top 100 Schools for Cricket in the Country.
- $\bullet$  Crawley Urban Plan significant progress made during 2022 with over £125k worth of investment to fund 11 non-turf pitches across the town.
- Women & Girls continued growth with plans in place for the launch of a Sussex Women's Premier League in summer 2023.
- Continued support to our communities through our Sporting Memories and Walking Cricket programmes

My own personal highlight was us becoming the first professional club to host a County Disability fixture at The 1st Central County Ground. On 19th June 2022, we created history when our D40 team took on Surrey in front of a crowd of more than 300 people. Not only did Sussex win but one of our players, Alfie Pyle went on to score 162 in an incredible inning. This moment sums up what the Foundation is about, creating memories, inspiring a passion for cricket, and actively changing lives. This is a moment that will live long in the memory of everyone that was involved in an incredible day.

Despite all the successes we know there will be challenges ahead, but we are in the best place possible to overcome these should they arise. We must not become complacent, and we need to continue to fundraise and seek new community partners to join us on the exciting journey we find ourselves on. In March we will be welcoming ex-Premier League Manager, Sam Allardyce to Sussex as our guest speaker at our Where Cricket Meets, which is our biggest fundraising event and raises money to support our projects.

None of the above happens without my team, and they all deserve a huge amount of credit for all their hard work and commitment to continually delivering our objectives. Every member of the team has contributed to our successes, and they should all be proud of the part that they have played.



#### SUPPORTING REFUGEES

Through funding received from the ECB and in partnership with Crawley Borough Council, we supported the relocation of Afghan Families in and around the surrounding areas of Crawley. The funding enabled us to engage with the families and provide opportunities for children to access the game, signposting them to local clubs in the process.

During the season we welcomed over 100 families to join us for one of our Championship games and also provided tickets for our T20 vs. Glamorgan.

## URBAN PLANS

#### **URBAN CRICKET PLANS**

In the summer of 2021, we launched two Urban Cricket Plans in Brighton & Crawley. Significant focus and investment has been put towards our Crawley plans with over £125,000 worth of investment going towards installing 11 non-turf pitches across the town. During 2023 whilst continuing to focus on facilities in Crawley, mainly indoor, we will be putting focus into actions identified in Brighton to improve facilities across the city.

#### **BRIGHTON**

Discussions are underway around improving Council-maintained sites in Brighton & Hove and a large longer-term project around the LGBTQ+ community and how better to engage and promote inclusivity. Also, funding and improvements work are underway on providing better quality indoor facilities at existing sites.

#### **CRAWLEY**

6 x artificial pitches fully funded and timetabled for installation ready for the 2023 season (all Crawley-based teams will play home matches at a venue in Crawley in 2023). A further 5 artificials to be installed as part of partnership funding from LCT at additional sites in Crawley. Site visit, proposed works and budget all readied for a brand-new 3-lane indoor net facility to be installed at the Apple Tree Centre in early 2023. This will provide a new indoor facility and two further venues, based at Oriel and ICC now available for use for clubs indoor training. 3 girls teams set up and running across Crawley with funding secured to deliver additional project work to increase participation and sustain growing numbers, across what will be 3 Wicketz hubs, a new Girls only Street Cricket hub and a Girls only 'taster' hub for new participants.

### 1ST CENTRAL SUSSEX CRICKET LEAGUE

The 1st Central Sussex Cricket League continues to grow, with more clubs wanting to enter teams into the structure. Based upon feedback from our clubs, we have restructured the bottom divisions for 2023 so clubs play less games to ease the burden of fielding teams on a weekly basis and to minimize travel where possible. The League Committee are looking at a wider restructure in time for the start of the 2024 season.

### SUSSEX WOMENS PREMIER LEAGUE

This summer we will be launching the first ever Womens Premier League in Sussex. The league will be initially formed of 5 teams with a feeder league featuring a further 8 teams. The ambition is to increase the number of teams in the Premier League over the next 12-24 months whilst aiming to improve the quality of cricket played and number of women playing hardball cricket.

#### **CHAMPIONS FUND**

This fund has been created to help support talented young cricketers across the County. We believe that there should be no barriers in place to accessing the game and this fund helps support costs associated to playing cricket. To continue our support to young cricketers across the County, we need to ensure we identify ways of securing further funds to help continue our support.

#### **DISABILITY CRICKET**

Disability Cricket continues to thrive in Sussex. In 2022 we became the first professional county to host a County Disability fixture and had record numbers attend our annual DIScoverABILITY Day. In 2023 we will be delivering more programmes in schools, funded by Lord Taverners, and aiming to recruit more players to join our 3 County Teams which, continue to receive excellent

support from our sponsors Webtrends Optimize and 1st Central. Our D40 team will once again play a fixture at The 1st Central County Ground to continue to make them feel apart of Sussex Cricket.
