Despite the ongoing COVID pandemic, 2021 has been another incredible year for the Sussex Cricket Foundation, which has seen a huge rise in participation and general interest in our great game. This year's report shows how much the game has grown and continues to grow across the County in our schools, clubs, and communities.

The year started slowly with staff furloughed and delivery on all our programmes suspended. It was not until April where all our team returned to work and delivery was able to safely resume in clubs, schools & community settings. We were also able to relaunch annual events such as DIScoverABILITY Day, Junior Champions League, and our Workplace B'Ashes.

What we have seen since April has quite simply been incredible with more people of all ages, abilities and genders wanting to play the game and more clubs being formed in the process. Our clubs continue to thrive and were able to compete fully in The 1st Central Sussex Cricket League, Newbery Cricket Junior Leagues, Women & Girls Leagues, and the Sussex Slam.

There have been many highlights during 2021 including record numbers signing up to national programmes, the continued growth of our Disability Cricket programmes, increase in clubs supporting Women & Girls Cricket, and the launch of our Urban Cricket Plans for Brighton & Crawley to name a few.

Supporting our communities continues to be of extreme importance to us, especially during these challenging times. The launch of our Sussex Cricket Mental Health & Wellbeing Hub, continuation of programmes such as Sporting Memories & Walking Cricket and initiatives such as 'In the Bag' show that cricket can be used as a tool to support those in need.

Towards the end of 2021 we managed to successfully deliver our gala fundraising lunch, Where Cricket Meets. This year we welcomed ex England International Glenn Hoddle to Sussex who shared stories of his glittering playing & managerial career. The event was a huge success and thanks to everyone's generosity we raised more than £40,000. This money will be used to support Disability Cricket, Women & Girls Cricket, Urban Cricket Plans, and our Champions

We continue to grow as a team and have recently recruited 5 new Community Coaches, including 3 new female coaches, to join our team. My team deserve huge credit for their hard work, passion, and commitment to help deliver our objectives. Every member of the team has played a part in the successes we have achieved, and they should all be proud of this fact.

I would like to say a special thank you to my Leadership Team, Jon Filby (Chair), Rob Andrew (Chief Executive) and all our Community Partners for their continued support, it is greatly appreciated.

Looking ahead to 2022, there is plenty to look forward to as we aim to continue growing the game across our communities and help to actively change lives through the power of cricket. STREET CRICKET

Hubs

We ran 7 hubs across the county. Hastings, Eastbourne, Crew Club and Manor Gym in Brighton, Southwick, Littlehampton, and Chichester.

We have had over 130 children attend our various Street Hubs.

Our annual Street Cricket tournament was held at Southwick Leisure Centre on 9th August. It involved 65 children forming 9 teams from across the county.

WICKETZ

We delivered across three hubs, all of which are in Crawley. Two of the three are based out of Youth Centres and have strong attendance across a range of ages, both boys and girls. We have in excess of 30 children taking part across the two sites, with a 40% attendance from girls. The third site is based out of ICC and is getting back up and running post-Covid, with the focus being on driving up numbers, back towards the 20+ attendance we previously had.

Participants - More than 40, of which 40% are female.

CRAWLEY TIF FUNDED PROJECTS

We now have three Crawley-based clubs offering girls cricket and collectively this has seen over 50 girls between U10 and U15 now playing the game. We have joined forces with COGs and Rivers, both of which are organisations in Crawley supporting vulnerable or inactive women and girls to better showcase opportunities available to them. We have delivered 1-day sports days and plan on working with the local mosques and religious centres over the closed season. For the women, we now have three club setups for women with more than 20 women taking part regularly in cricket and running three successful WSB festivals. We have partnered with the council to run summer holiday activities for girls only and also Community based pop-up events in open Council spaces.



CRAWLEY URBAN PLAN

Ring fenced £50k towards delivering change in Crawley with further support expected from ECB to support facility investment. The plan is to install at least 5 NTP's for wider use across the town, meaning all teams from clubs in Crawley can return to play home matches in Crawley. Phase two will be to improve the existing net facilities in Crawley and look to build at least 1 new permanent outdoor net facility, as well as improve the provision for indoor play by working with the Council and the K2 to invest in their cricket facilities.

BRIGHTON & HOVE URBAN PLAN

Working in partnership with the Council and ECB to support investment into existing indoor facilities that need a refurb to better support the needs of the clubs for indoor practice space. This is identified across three sites in Brighton & Hove. Discussions about also investing into improving the quality of the ancillary facilities at Council-controlled venues across sites in Brighton to better support those clubs with multiple sides who need additional playing facilities.

IMPLEMENTATION OF URBAN CRICKET PLANS

Following the launch of our Urban Cricket Plans for Brighton & Crawley, we are now starting to implement the various actions identified. Both are 5 yr. plans and aim to help the growth and development of cricket in two key areas of our County. There is a heavy emphasis on both plans to improve the quality and provision of facilities both indoors and outdoors, whilst continuing to raise the profile of cricket across our communities.

CHAMPIONS FUND

In 2021 the Sussex Cricket Foundation set up a 'Champions Fund' to help financially support talented and aspiring young cricketers across the County. Covid has affected people in a variety of ways, mainly financially and with cricket traditionally being an expensive sport to play, we decided to create a fund that helped improve access to the game and financially support those in need. Any funds raised will be used to support talented players who are a part of our Sussex Cricket Pathway with training/equipment costs. This includes all players, approx.. 800, that are selected in our boys, girls and disability squads. We will also be using the fund to support players, boys/girls/players with disabilities, from our recreational cricket clubs. There are 185 affiliated clubs to Sussex Cricket and we want to help support junior players of all backgrounds, genders and abilities with costs associated with playing the game e.g. membership costs, clothing/ equipment costs. This fund is extremely important to Sussex Cricket as we aim to actively change lives through the power of cricket and we see this fund as one way of doing that.

ACCESSIBILITY TO SUSSEX CRICKET

In 2022 we want to encourage as many visitors to The 1st Central County Ground as possible through events such as our DIScoverABILITY Day, Schools Day/s and Club Day/s. We want to make Sussex Cricket as accessible as possible for all in our schools, clubs and local communities.

VOLUNTEERS

Volunteers are crucial to the running of recreational cricket in clubs. To help recruit and attract more volunteers into Cricket, we are currently writing an SCF Volunteer Strategy to be launched during 2022. 2022 will also see a variety of courses organised to help train and upskill coaches, scorers, umpires, scorers, groundsman and welfare officers as we prepare for the new season. As well as helping recruit volunteers in clubs we are also looking to recruit volunteers to help run SCF initiatives such as Sporting Memories and Walking Cricket.
